\$23 Million in Medicare Payments Made on Behalf of Deceased Beneficiaries


Despite safeguards, the OIG reported that CMS inappropriately paid \$23 million in 2011 to providers, suppliers, Medicare Advantage organizations, and prescription drug plan sponsors on behalf of beneficiaries who died in 2009, 2010, or 2011.
