Medicare Makes MSNs Available Electronically

Since October 1, beneficiaries have been able to opt out of receiving quarterly paper MSNs instead choosing to receive monthly eMSNs. The new eMSNs contain more information than that offered in the claims section on MyMedicare.gov.
